Osamu Miura, Ph.D., Assistant Professor in Science Research Center for IMT Project, has awarded INAMORI Foundation Research Grants.

Osamu Miura, Ph.D. has been selected for INAMORI Foundation Research Grants in the area of natural science in 2013. His research interests focus on marine ecology, in particular "Disturbance and recovery process of mudflat organisms -Ecological and genetic comparisons of *Batillaria* snails before and after the 2011Tohoku Earthquake". There were 50 candidates (40 for natural science, 10 for humanity and social science) for who have been chosen. Additionally, HAKURAKU\*1, honors research grants, are awarded him for two consecutive years by approve from the board of committee.

\*1 HAKURAKU was originally named after Chinese classical literature called "千里 馬常有 而伯楽不常有\*2". This research grants will be provided for two consecutive years for those who have been recommended by Nomination Committee of Research Grants and approve by the board of committee.
