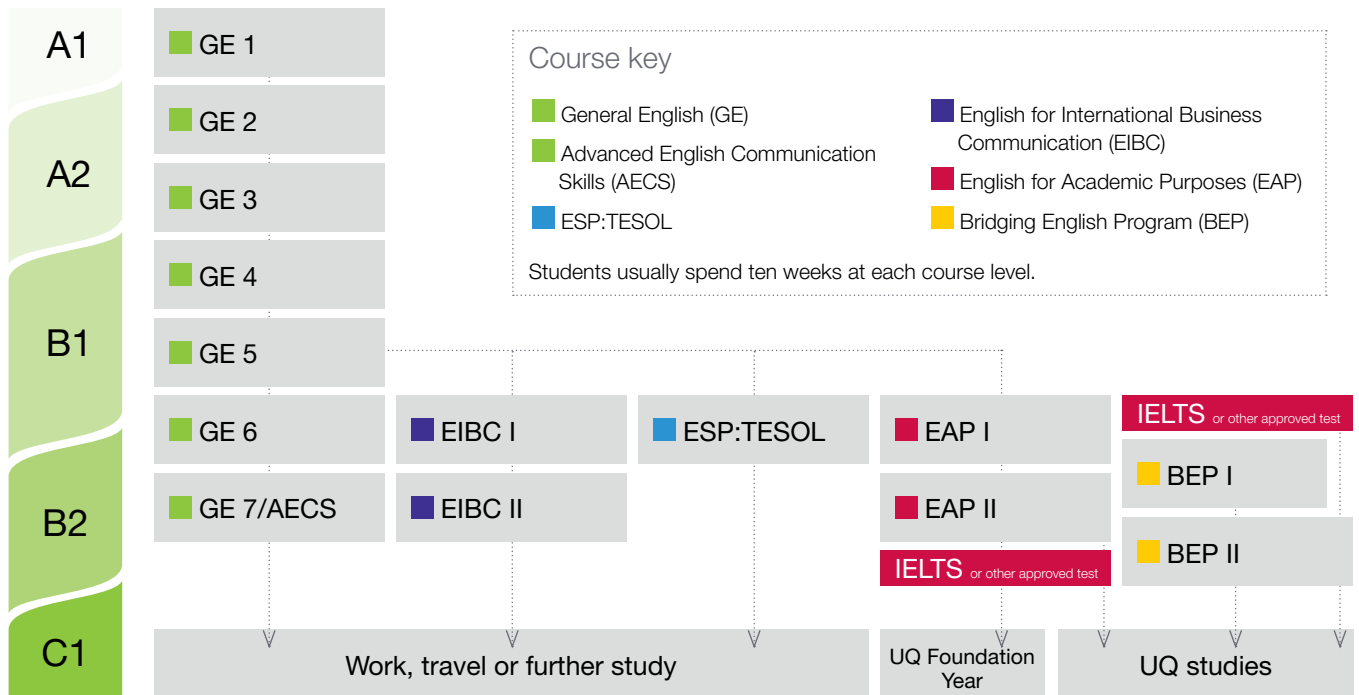
STUDY OPTIONS

We will test you on your first day and place you in a course and class level that matches your English language skills and learning goals.

If you already have an IELTS or other official English language test score, and meet the entry requirements, you can apply for the course you want to be placed in before you arrive.

ABOUT OUR COURSES

ICTE-UQ offers English language courses from pre-elementary to advanced levels.

Each class has a maximum of 18 students to practise your speaking and listening skills by working in pairs and small groups, and there are lots of opportunities to ask your teachers questions.

ICTE-UQ courses include 20 hours of face-to-face teaching and five hours of **SKILL-UP** directed self-access learning each week.

About **SKILL-UP**

SKILL-UP gives you time to reinforce and build on classroom teaching at your own pace. It also gives you the option to focus on and extend the skills you most want to develop by creating your own flexible personalised learning program.

Your teachers will direct you towards a range of fun, interactive online learning activities and exercises that match your course, class level and learning needs.

You can choose to complete your **SKILL-UP** learning in the timetabled sessions or at a time that suits you.

Students who want to fast-track their learning can undertake extra **SKILL-UP** sessions in their timetable.

ENGLISH LANGUAGE PATHWAYS TO UQ

If you meet all the academic requirements for entry into an undergraduate or postgraduate program (degree) at UQ, but need to improve your English language skills you may be eligible for a 'Package Offer' that includes

- An ICTE-UQ English language course; and
- A place in a UQ program (conditional on meeting the English language entry requirements).

Depending on your current IELTS or other recognised test score you will be offered a place in one of the following two English language pathways

- Bridging English Program (BEP): ten or 20 weeks
- General English (GE) + English for Academic Purposes (EAP): Variable length.

BEP students can use their final course grades to show they meet UQ's English language entry requirements. GE + EAP students can take an IELTS test at the end of their English language course to show they meet UQ's English language entry requirements.

IELTS[®] TESTING

IELTS is trusted around the world as a secure and independent test of English. It is recognised by more than 8,000 organisations including employers, universities and government agencies and can help you apply for study opportunities, work and immigration.

ICTE-UQ is an award-winning IELTS test administration centre. Tests are held two to three times each month on Saturdays. You can book and pay for an IELTS test with your course enrolment.

GENERAL ENGLISH

GE courses are ideal for students who want to improve their ability to communicate in English in social and work situations.

What will you learn?

GE will enable you to

- Use English with greater confidence
- Develop your ability to understand real-life conversations
- Understand a variety of spoken and written media such as television programs and websites
- Read with greater understanding
- Speak with increasing fluency, clarity and accuracy
- Develop and extend your grammar knowledge.

What will you study?

GE classes are topic based, interactive and dynamic. Modern course materials, including print and digital content, are used to engage and stimulate the student.

Course content focuses on the development of communication skills with a balance of speaking, listening, reading and writing tasks.

You will learn through class activities, and individual, pair and small group work.

Course modules include

- Speaking, Listening, Grammar and Vocabulary Skills
- Reading Skills
- Writing Skills.

What will you learn?

AECS will enable you to

- Improve your ability to understand native-speakers
- Increase your vocabulary and knowledge of common English phrases
- Refine your ability to use English grammar accurately
- Improve the accuracy and fluency of your pronunciation
- Clearly discuss world issues and current events
- Understand a range of real-world listening and reading materials
- Write extensively and creatively on topics of interest.

What will you study?

The AECS course uses a wide variety of study materials including advanced English course books, magazines, journals, the internet and real-life TV, radio shows and movies.

Course modules include

- Integrated Skills: speaking, listening and grammar
- Advanced Reading Skills
- Advanced Writing Skills
- News and World Affairs: newspapers, magazines, the internet, TV and radio are used to develop listening, reading and discussion skills.

AECS students also undertake a class project which can involve writing and performing a live play, directing and filming a documentary or producing individual video diaries (digital stories).

ENGLISH FOR INTERNATIONAL BUSINESS COMMUNICATION

The EIBC course develops students' confidence to use English in real world business situations.

What will you learn?

EIBC will enable you to

- Write business correspondence and reports
- Actively contribute to business meetings
- Deliver formal business presentations
- Gain knowledge of current business terminology and communication practices.

What will you study?

EIBC classes use modern course books as well as real-world listening and reading materials from the media, the internet and business journals.

EIBC class exercises and projects are based on a weekly theme such as Setting up a Business, Team Building, Negotiation, Marketing or Customer Service.

Course modules include

- Business English Skills: development of speaking, listening, reading and writing skills

- Business Correspondence: reading and writing resumes, letters, memos, emails and promotional materials as well as appropriate language for business reports

- Audio-Visual: development of listening skills and business vocabulary using current television programs

- Business Presentation Skills: development of speaking, research and computer skills through preparing and delivering group and individual PowerPoint presentations

- Case Studies/Business Meetings/Role-plays to simulate real-life business experiences

- Business Visits: a visit to a workplace or trade show to meet and speak with business people (one per five-week session)

- Listening and Note-taking: a business lecture given by a university lecturer, business professional or business English teacher (three lectures per five-week session).

GO GLOBAL

English language, workplace preparation and internship program

Go Global is a three-step, packaged program to assist students, graduates and young professionals to launch their careers.

It includes ten or 15 weeks of English language studies at ICTE-UQ, professional development

workshops to prepare you for the global workforce, and an eight-week professional internship placement arranged by our program partner Australian Internships.

Most students choose to study a GE or EIBC

course as part of their Go Global program.

ENGLISH FOR SPECIFIC PURPOSES: TESOL

The ESP:TESOL course is ideal for students who are considering becoming a teacher of English as a second language (ESL) or who are already ESL teachers in their own country.

What will you learn?

ESP:TESOL will enable you to

- Improve your English communication skills
- Develop your knowledge and understanding of current English language teaching methods
- Learn practical activities which can be used for teaching English
- Develop English language and classroom management skills through practice teaching sessions
- Become familiar with and have practise for the Cambridge English Teaching Knowledge Test (TKT). The TKT is an assessment tool that aims to increase your confidence and potential future job or training prospects to become an English language teacher or work further in the TESOL field.

The TKT is held on the Friday or Saturday after each five-week ESP:TESOL course.

What will you study?

Course modules include

- Integrated Language Skills: speaking, listening, reading and writing skills development using general and TESOL-related themes
- English for Specific Purposes (ESP): analysis and discussion of current methods for



teaching English and language used in teaching

- Practice Teaching Session: assisted preparation for and guided feedback on a Practice Teaching Session
- TKT Preparation: familiarisation and practise for the TKT. Each five-week ESP:TESOL module prepares students for two TKT modules
 - ESP:TESOL A: Module 1: Background to language teaching; and KAL: Knowledge About Language
 - ESP:TESOL B: Module 2: Planning for language teaching; and Module 3: Classroom Management.

Please note: While ESP:TESOL contains content related to teaching English, the course is not a formal teaching qualification.

What will you learn?

EAP will enable you to

- Understand spoken English in conversations, discussions and lectures and to take notes
- Speak clearly and confidently
- Apply a range of reading skills in order to understand and make notes on a variety of written texts
- Express facts, ideas and opinions in writing, using correct and appropriate vocabulary, grammatical structures and other features of academic writing
- Use a range of study skills including research skills, in order to gather, combine and critically examine information and ideas from different sources
- Apply the skills and language studied to the IELTS test.

What will you study?

EAP course materials and assessment reflect the type of activities and learning environment students experience in a degree or academic study program.

Course modules include

- Academic Reading & Writing: a variety of texts are used to develop reading and note-taking skills. Written work develops students' abilities to construct complex sentences, paragraphs and essays
- IELTS Preparation: practise all areas of the IELTS test, including test-taking strategies and timed practice
- Formal Talks: practise organising, writing and delivering a spoken presentation
- Listening & Note-taking: a live or recorded lecture to practise listening and note-taking skills.

BRIDGING ENGLISH PROGRAM

The BEP is a ten-week or 20-week English language pathway for entry into undergraduate and postgraduate programs including Study Abroad at The University of Queensland.

About the BEP pathway

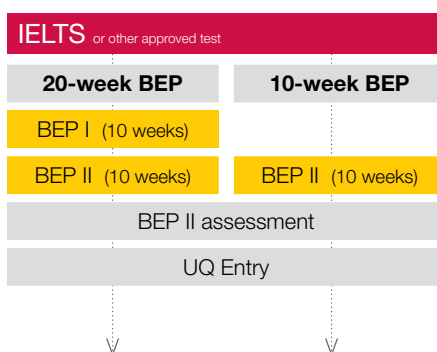
The BEP pathway includes two 10-week modules, BEP I and BEP II

- The 20-week BEP includes BEP I and BEP II
- The 10-week BEP includes BEP II only.

What will you learn?

The BEP will enable you to develop the specialist English language skills needed for UQ program entry and studies. The course develops proficiency in all four skills

- Speaking: participating in academic discussions, presenting information to an audience, managing seminar discussions
- Listening: understanding information presented in academic and general settings
- Reading: understanding information from academic texts
- Writing: researching and writing an academic essay and writing under exam conditions.

Assessment and UQ entry

Assessment tasks and tests are administered to evaluate the development of speaking, listening, reading and writing skills. Students who meet all BEP II exit requirements will be eligible to enter UQ. Twenty-week BEP students will need to maintain suitable academic progress to move from BEP I to BEP II.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

If you do not have a current IELTS (or other official test score), please apply for a General English (GE) course. We will test you on arrival and place you in a course and class level.

Depending on your English language skills

and study goals, we will place you in either GE, Advanced English Communication Skills (AECS), English for International Business Communication (EIBC), English for Specific Purposes (ESP):TESOL or English for Academic Purposes (EAP).

If you would like to be placed in a class other than GE before you arrive, or want to apply for the Bridging English Program (BEP), please provide an official IELTS or other recognised test score with your course application.

UQ FOUNDATION YEAR

If you want to study at UQ, but do not meet the academic entry requirements you may be eligible for the UQ Foundation Year program (FYP) delivered by International Education Services (IES).

The UQ Foundation Year program provides a bridge between your secondary (high school) studies and undergraduate programs at UQ. If you achieve specific standards you will be guaranteed a place in the first year of most undergraduate programs at UQ (quotas apply in some programs).

Academic and English language entry requirements apply for the UQ Foundation Year program.

If you meet all the academic entry requirements for the UQ Foundation Year program, but require further study to meet the English language entry requirements, you can apply for a 'Package Offer' that includes

- an ICTE-UQ General English (GE) or English for Academic Purposes (EAP) course; and
- the UQ Foundation Year program.

If you have an IELTS score that is lower than 4.5, you will need to take another IELTS test at the end of your ICTE-UQ English course to show you meet the English language entry requirements to continue to the UQ Foundation Year program.

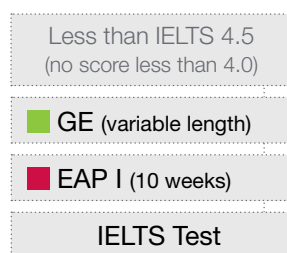
If you have an IELTS score of 4.5 or more, you can apply for the ICTE-UQ FYP English Bridging Pathway Program (FYP:EBPP). FYP:EBPP students do not have to take an IELTS exam at the end of their English Language studies to enter the UQ Foundation Year program.

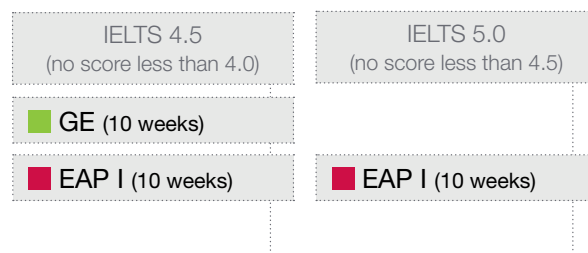


UQ Foundation Year pathways

- 2** Receive your offer

ICTE-UQ will send you

 - A Letter of Offer confirming your course dates, fees you need to pay and due dates for payment.
 - An Enrolment Agreement for you to sign and return.
- 3** Sign and return your enrolment agreement and pay your fees

You can pay your fees by electronic bank transfer and credit card.
- 4** Receive confirmation of your enrolment

ICTE-UQ will send you an Acceptance Letter confirming your enrolment together with information about your first day at ICTE-UQ including what time you need to arrive and what you need to bring.

If you are applying for a Student Visa, ICTE-UQ will also send you an electronic Confirmation of Enrolment (e-CoE) so that you can apply for a visa at your closest Australian Visa office.
